


UPSS Stamped Envelope Size Chart


# **Envelope Knife Illustrations**


A knife is a sharp-edged metal form used to cut envelope blanks like a cookie cutter. In the 19<sup>th</sup> century, envelope blanks were made by forcing the knife with a hydraulic press through a pile of up to 500 sheets. The knife was then repositioned and another set of blanks cut from the same sheets. This process was repeated until as many blanks as possible were cut from the sheets. In philately we refer to knife as the


shape of envelope cut by a particular metal knife.


It should be apparent from the previous description that metal knives wore out and needed to be replaced. The replacement may have varied slightly in shape from the original. Therefore it is important to recognize that knives shown on the following pages are actually a family a shapes that varied slightly over time.













Nesbitt Knife, top and bottom flaps broadly rounded, compare to Knife 24.




Nesbitt Knife, first patent line type, lines on bottom flap; wide and deep throat.




Nesbitt Knife, patent lines; wide and deep curved throat; all curves broadly rounded.




Nesbitt Knife, patent lines; deep, pointed throat; shoulders on side flaps.



Knives 25, 26, and 27 are very similar and, perhaps, should have been combined as minor variations but are presented for historical and reference value.












Reay Knife, broadly rounded side flaps; high bottom flap.



Plimpton-Morgan Knife, used for this size until 1950; bottom over sides (Knife 106); sides over bottom (Knife 107).







Nesbitt Knife, top corners of bottom are broadly rounded, the common knife for this size in the higher values of the Nesbitt issues.






